TRANSFERRED TO A TRAIN AND CAME
THE REST OF THE WAY INTO LE HARE STATION
THEN LOADED ON TRUCKS AGAIN AND WAS
BROUGHT TO THE BEACH. THERE WE LOADED
ONTO A L.C.I. WAS BROUGHT TO THE SHIP.
IT WAS A LIBERTY SHIP. THE S.S. RICHARD BASSETT.
WE LOADED ON BOARD SHIP AT 4:00 P.M.
WE STAYED IN THE HARBOR ALL NIGHT.

MAY 14, 1945 - DID NOT MOVE UNTIL 5:30 P.M. WE LEFT
LE HARE AND WENT OUTSIDE THE HARBOR AND THEN
DROPPED ANCHOR AGAIN

MAY 15, 1945 - LEFT THE FRENCH COAST SOMETIME
DURING THE NIGHT. WE CROSSED THE CHANNEL
TO ENGLAND AND THEN DROPPED ANCHOR AGAIN.
BEEN HERE THE REST OF THE DAY.

MAY 16, 1945 - LAID AT ANCHOR ALL DAY.

MAY 17, 1945 - AT 8:00 P.M. THE ANCHOR WAS PULLED
UP AND WE WERE UNDER WAY HOME.

MAY 27, 1945 - 10 DAYS OUT - 3 SHIPS HIT ICEBERGS - 22
SHIPS IN ALL COLLIDED IN THE FOG. SHIPS
ON EACH SIDE OF US WAS HIT.

JUNE 3, 1945 - DOCKED AT PIER 84 44TH STREET AT
20 MINUTES AFTER MIDNIGHT. GOT OFF
THE BOAT AT 7:00 A.M.
